The aim of my master's thesis was to interrogate the complex relationship between art museums and participatory archiving practices, and how this relationship can contribute to tackling social exclusion in art museums. It focused on three case studies, and the data collection methods were desk research and ethnographic interviews. I analysed my data by using a deductive thematic analysis, which led me to my three main findings: the case studies incorporate some recurrent interpretations of the term *participation*; these practices promote what I referred to as *personalization of participation*; the interaction between visitors and archived materials can extend its influence on individuals' personal archives.

October 2022 - December 2022	<i>Behind a Bookcase</i> : evaluating participatory archiving practices at the Jan van Eyck Academy (JvE)
Coordinator: Christian Ernsten	This research investigated how the JvE adopted participatory archiving practices in managing its stored material. The study was conducted through the ethnographic method and a subsequent deductive thematic analysis. After literature research concerning the topic of <i>participatory archiving practices</i> , I defined three main indicators: accessibility, interaction, and transparency. Subsequently, the application of these indicators to the collected data allowed me to interpret the practices of the JvE regarding the management of its archives.

Additionally, it emphasized the role of the project's spatial dimension in shaping discourse production and facilitating the construction of participatory memory. The research shed light on the instrumentalization of participatory and narrative practices in cultural policies and their connection to specific European narrative strategies.
